How did you start writing books?

I went to night school for some years, and I would tell my daughter stories in the evening. When I finished school, my wife said, "Why don't you write the stories down?" That was in 2005.

I spent evenings and weekends writing four books in one year. Within a year I found a local publisher, Simply Read Books. So the first two are now in print, and the third one is due out this fall. And next year we'll publish the last one.

In each book, I focus on an underlying idea. The first book talks about sharing. Chantel is a 12-year old who has to find four relics. On her birthday, she finds out she is the last descendant of her family, and has to go on this quest. In the first book, she is looking for a golden sword, and it's a symbol for sharing, not fighting.

In the meantime, I've written six more books. The next is a three-book series called Vita, about two tribes with special powers. It's nice to be creative! With fantasy novels, you're not bound by anything.

Prices rise on April 1 for FareCards and FareSavers

There's no easy way to say this, but the cost of transit monthly FareCards and FareSaver tickets will go up as of April 1, 2010. DayPasses and cash fares will stay the same.

West Coast Express fares will also increase on April 1—visit www.westcoastexpress.com to see those fare changes.

It's small comfort, but the reason we are increasing fares is to pay for the expanded service we have put in place since 2004.

That includes Canada Line, Golden Ears Bridge, a new SeaBus, 48 new rail

vehicles, 304 new buses, an additional 92,000 bus service hours, and the Central Valley Greenway biking and walking path.

The increase in fares is expected to bring in an additional \$18 million per year in revenue.

Coast Meridian Overpass opens in Port Coquitlam

On March 7, the Coast Meridian Overpass officially opened to traffic. The Overpass provides a much-needed third link between north and south Port Coquitlam, improving mobility and access throughout the City and region. Plus, reduced congestion on Lougheed Highway results in less air pollution from idling vehicles.

The project was funded by the City of Port Coquitlam, TransLink, the Province of BC, and ICBC. It's one of the largest projects to be funded through TransLink's Regional Major Road Network major capital program, and is Port Coquitlam's largest-ever transportation project to date.

To commemorate the opening, a celebration event was held on March 6th. Festivities included a parade, street hockey game, live music, tasty eats, displays and a ribbon-cutting ceremony.

SeaBus starts one hour early (7:01 a.m. from Lonsdale Quay) with 15 min. service until mid afternoon. West Coast Express will operate a 'Sun Run' train departing Mission at 7 a.m. and returning from Waterfront at 1 p.m.

SkyTrain's expanded fleet means better service

The Olympics are over, but Expo/ Millennium Line commuters will continue to benefit from the recent 48-car fleet expansion.

The last of the new blue and grey cars went into service in January, meeting our commitment of a 30 per cent capacity increase in time for the Olympics. Funded by TransLink and the federal and provincial governments, these



cars are a part of TransLink's strategy to respond to the ridership growth and crowding experienced by daily commuters, and to further encourage transit ridership through the future.


SkyTrain now delivers close to 15,000 passenger spaces per hour in each direction over the main section of line between Waterfront and Columbia. The use of longer trains provide more space mid-day and evenings as well.
