BACK ISSUES

The Buzzer has been published since June 2, 1916! So in this section we mine our back issues for nuggets of transit history. Huzzah!

1975 (Psst: this Back Issue item comes courtesy of transit enthusiast Stefan Ewing. Thanks Stefan!)

In the early 1970s, the transfer policy was strict—you could only transfer at designated transfer points; you couldn't



get off one bus and use the transfer to get on another bus on the same route; and you couldn't use the transfer for a round trip, either.

So in the May 30, 1975 issue, as the City of Vancouver property tax deadline came up, the Buzzer announced the following: BC Hydro will issue special transfers which permit a stopover at City Hall, effective from June 2 to July 3. This permits a break in a continuous journey. It does not allow a return trip. Ask for a transfer when you pay your fare and be sure to have it stamped at City Hall to be valid for the continued trip.

How things have changed—today you can use a transfer on any service in any direction for 90 minutes!

Bus service changes begin June 21

VANCOUVER, BURNABY, RICHMOND

19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park

Summer service will start for the 19, which takes passengers from Pender and Cambie to Stanley Park Bus Loop. The service will run 9 a.m. – 8 p.m. Mon-Fri and 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. on weekends.

401 Garden City/One Road

The last eastbound trip (leaving Chatham & 2nd Ave. at 1:26 a.m.) will terminate at No. 5 Road and Steveston Highway, eliminating a duplication on a stretch of Steveston Highway shared with the 403 Bridgeport Station/Three Road. Customers going to that portion of Steveston Highway on the 401 will have to transfer to the 403.

NightBus Downtown Terminus bus bays

Owing to the new Dunsmuir bike lane, several stops have moved. The N24 will stop on Howe St instead of Dunsmuir St. The N8 will now stop at Pender and Howe instead of Dunsmuir St as well.

TRI-CITIES

C26 Buntzen Lake Special/Coquitlam Station Special

Starting June 26, the summer C26 Community Shuttle will operate between Buntzen Lake and Coquitlam Station every hour on weekends and holidays. The first bus leaves Coquitlam Station at 9:30 a.m.; the last bus leaves Buntzen Lake at 9:05 p.m.

to use fully-electronic tolling, and over three million vehicles have crossed the bridge since its opening!

The **Central Valley Greenway** also celebrates its first birthday on June 27. The 24-kilometre bicycle and pedestrian pathway connects downtown Vancouver, Burnaby, and New Westminster. Over 600,000 people have used the Greenway in its first year!
