Wintering at Peace River

About 700 construction workers will be spending this winter on the banks of the Peace River - 500 air miles north of Vancouver - to shape a new route for the river during initial stages of the Peace Power project.

The men are blasting an 800 by 280-foot diversion channel and three tunnels each 2,500 feet long and 48 feet in diameter. Early next fall, the river will flow through the channel-tunnel system around a 3,000-foot section of the existing riverbed.

Workforce will then enter the dry riverbed and prepare the foundations for the 650-foot-high Portage Mountain Dam.

How about a portable plug-in timer? It's compact and useful for a variety of jobs.

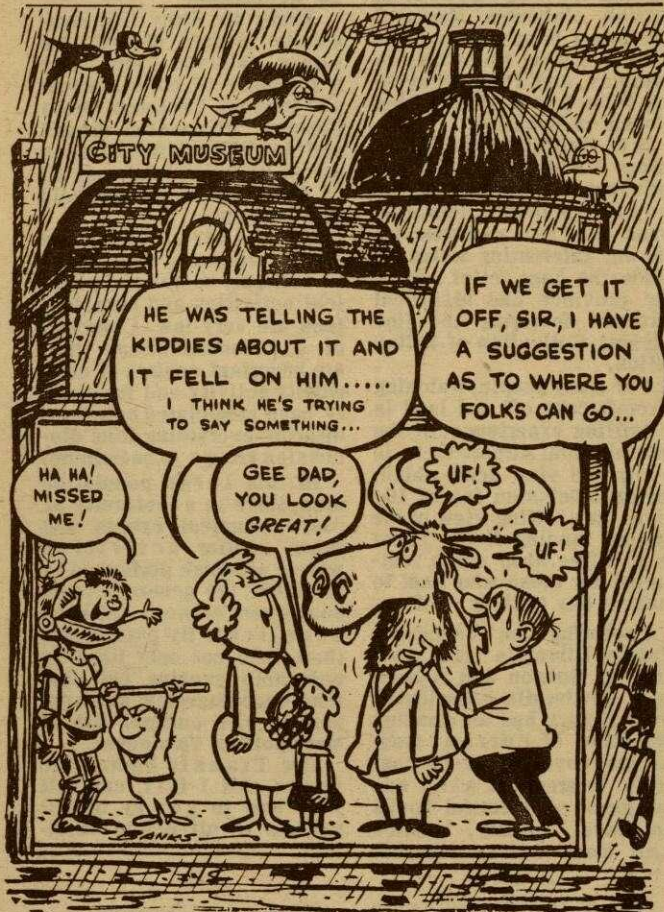
