1942 This month's Back Issue comes from May 1, 1942.

Things are happening to people's habits so fast that it's hard to keep pace with them. Take Saturday night for instance. A few years ago people went home at a respectable

hour, presumably to take a bath but now – zowie! They stay out until all hours, attending late shows and frequenting midnight eating places. One of our traffic men who follows trends closely says it's because people have lots of money to spend whereas a few years ago, they were out of work. At any rate, traffic on the street cars between midnight Saturday and 2 a.m. Sunday morning is phenomenal. We're having to put out special cars just for the rush!



New bus stop locations at New Westminster Station

Effective Mon., May 3 the 112 Edmonds Stn/Lougheed Stn bus stops at New Westminster Station will be temporarily relocated one block north from Columbia St to Carnarvon St. due to construction of the Plaza 88 project.



VCC/Clark closed June 4-5

In June, TransLink is hosting the 2010 American Public Transportation Association (APTA) Rail Rodeo competition. Due to event activities, VCC/Clark Station will be closed June 4-5 and bus service to VCC/Clark will be rerouted from June 1-6.

If you normally use SkyTrain at VCC/Clark Station take the 9 bus on Broadway to connect at Commercial/Broadway Station instead. The 9 provides frequent service at all hours that SkyTrain would operate. Please allow extra travel time for SkyTrain connections on these days. SkyTrain service is expected to resume at VCC/Clark with the first train departure Sunday



morning June 6.

The 84 will operate from temporary stops on East 6th Ave from June 1-6. The service will depart westbound from a temporary stop on the north side of East 6th Ave at Keith St. For customers travelling eastbound, you may be dropped off at a temporary stop on the South side of East 6th Ave, or stay onboard the bus to be dropped off at Commercial/Broadway Station. Scheduled times should not be affected by this change. Service is slated to resume to the bus loop at VCC/Clark by Monday morning, June 7.

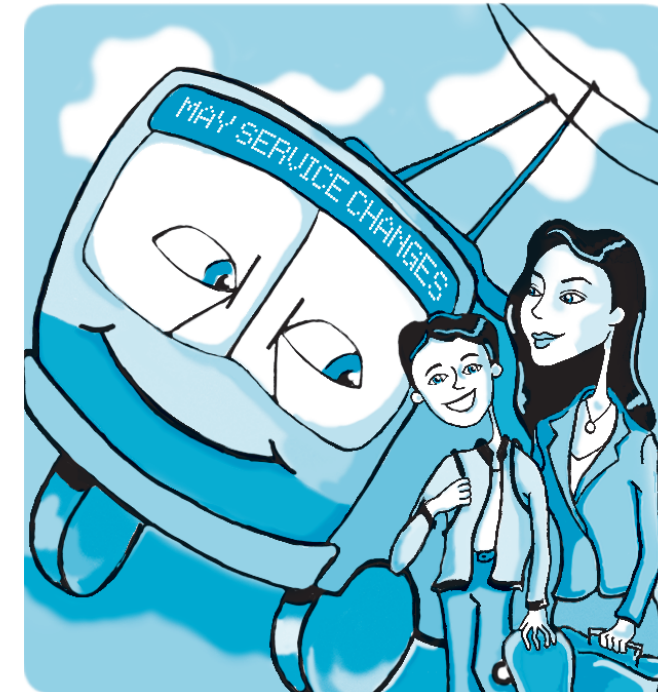

Spring bus service changes begin May 3

SURREY, DELTA, & WHITE ROCK

With Canada Line in service, Vancouver-bound customers are now leaving later for work. We are reorganizing service to reflect the higher demand later in the morning.

351 Crescent Beach/Bridgeport Station

From 7 to 8 a.m., the 351 will run every 10 minutes rather than 15 minutes.

352 Ocean Park/Bridgeport Station

354 White Rock Centre/Bridgeport Station

602 Tsawwassen Heights/Bridgeport

603 Beach Grove/Bridgeport

604 English Bluff/Bridgeport

These routes will all run more frequently between 7 and 8 a.m.

601 Bridgeport Station/South Delta/Boundary Bay

Between 6 and 8 a.m., the 601 will run every 8 to 9 minutes.

VANCOUVER

5 Robson

6 Davie

10 Downtown

Some buses that run "not in service" on Granville to reach their 5 Robson/6 Davie routes will now run as **10 Downtown** on those first trips.

15 Cambie/Downtown

Since many are now using the Canada Line to go downtown, the 15 will drop to every 12 minutes from every 10 minutes in the morning and afternoon rush hours, and to 15 minutes in midday. Resources saved can be used in future reallocations, so we can provide the greatest service with existing hours and vehicles.

NORTH SHORE

239 Park Royal/Lonsdale Quay/Phibbs Exchange/Capilano University

Mon-Fri service between Phibbs Exchange and Capilano University will be reduced to 20 minutes during peak times and 30 minutes during midday.

Trolley wires coming back to Granville Street

You might have noticed already, but the Trolley Overhead division from the Coast Mountain Bus Company has started reinstalling the trolley wire back on Granville Street. The wires had been taken down and trolley service re-routed off of Granville Street way back in 2006 for construction of the Canada Line.

The reinstallation project got underway on March 29, and is eventually slated to finish by August 30 once all the installation, testing, and commissioning is complete.

Bike to Work Week!

Bike to Work (and School) Week is taking place May 31 - June 6. If you've ever considered commuting to work or school by bike, it's a great time to start! Get in shape, cut your greenhouse gas emissions and save money by biking to work instead of driving.



The Vancouver Cycling Coalition (VACC) offers valuable resources to get you pedalling. Register at www.biketoworkmetrovan.ca and you can track your GHG reductions, distance travelled, and calories burned using their mapping and tracking tool. Compete with yourself or against other teams to win prizes, and share mapped routes to find co-workers to ride with.

To promote cycling to school, this year the VACC has launched www.biketoschoolmetrovan.ca, which features a kid-friendly mapping tool and the ability for elementary school teachers to enter their student's rides.

During the week commuter stations will offer cyclists tasty snacks, hot beverages, prizes and mechanical tune-ups. There is a brand new bike up for grabs, along with waterproof gear, clothing, and free tune-ups!

Always wanted to bike more, but concerned about safety, rain, or clothing? Take a VACC **Streetwise Cycling** bike skills course. The four-hour class teaches beginners and seasoned riders how to determine where to ride on the road, communicate with other road users, and plan the best routes. Course dates and locations are listed on VACC's website.

And don't forget to check out www.translink.ca for cycling maps, how to take bikes on transit, and bike locker rentals. Get out on May 31 and start pedaling!



Victoria Day holiday service

On **Monday, May 24** buses, SeaBus and SkyTrain will run on a Sunday schedule. West Coast Express, like the AirCare Inspection Centres, will not be in operation. A Sunday schedule means you can ride multiple zones on a single fare ticket.



UBC Line Rapid Transit Study

Help shape rapid transit for the Broadway corridor to UBC.

Working with our stakeholders, the UBC Line Rapid Transit Study team has identified six preliminary concepts for future rapid transit service in the Broadway corridor from Commercial Drive to UBC. We want to hear from you before we start developing more detailed designs based on these concepts.

With buses arriving every two to three minutes during peak times, conventional buses are already working near capacity along the corridor. Demand is expected to continue to grow, so a new solution is needed. The study is a joint initiative from TransLink and the Province of B.C.
